PLANT PARALYSIS

When an international Fortune 200 manufacturer of paints, coatings and specialty products experienced a water main break during a scheduled outage. Porta Kleen hurried to the scene to establish temporary infrastructure and keep the outage timeline intact.

Porta Kleen's emergency-response team arrived on-site within hours to survey the situation, assess the needs of the outage personnel, and determine the appropriate mobile solutions to meet the challenge.

The plant maintained normal operations throughout the process, saving countless amounts of man-hours and revenue that would have been lost during a protracted shut down.





CHEMICAL CONUNDRUM

When a chemical spill closed down the capital of West Virginia and prevented 300,000 residents from drinking, bathing, cooking or washing laundry with tap water, one of the first calls businesses made was to Porta Kleen.

Porta Kleen responded by dispatching a variety of equipment, including freshwater holding tanks, transfer pumps, mobile locker rooms, shower trailers, shower containers and mobile laundry trailers.

Porta Kleen has responded to emergency requests in the past, including Hurricane Sandy, Hurricane Katrina and ice storms in Kentucky.

"We're proud of our ability to rapidly respond to our customers in their times of need," said Porta Kleen President Adam Black.

HURRICANE HELP

After making landfall in August 2017, Hurricane Harvey unleashed heavy rainfall and damaging winds that decimated Southeastern Texas in only a few hours. Throughout the crisis, Porta Kleen stood prepared and ready.

"We realized very early on the level of destruction that this storm was going to cause and we knew that we had to be a part of the relief effort," said Adam Black, Porta Kleen's President.

Once the flood waters receded. emergency officials urgently requested 10 16-Stall Shower Trailers and

one 6-Stall Shower Trailer to be dispatched to the affected areas.

Once on location, Porta Kleen technicians quickly set up generators and water connections to each trailer and then staved on-site day and night to clean and maintain each unit. Many trailers operated 24 hours a day to support the people who were displaced.

But as the devastation spread, more trailers were required to alleviate the evolving need. FEMA and the Red Cross also asked for mobile laundry, locker room, and restroom trailers. resulting in more than 30 total Porta Kleen trailers within the state of Tex-

However, Mother Nature wasn't done yet. Tropical storm Irma reached hurricane status in early September and made landfall on September 9, resulting in aid requests from Southern Florida.

Leveraging trailers that had come available from private rental and demobilized base camps in Texas, Porta Kleen immediately dispatched 12 16-Stall Shower Trailers, three 8-Stall Shower Trailers, and one 6-Stall Shower Trailer to the Florida coastline.
